Dear Brad & Ann Souther:

The Community Development Director **APPROVED** the application for Historic Review of Exterior Alterations (HI-07-24) to add a central A/C and a back door with a landing deck and stairs on the rear of the historic home located at 805 5th Avenue SW. The City based its decision on the project's conformance with the review criteria listed in the Albany Development Code (ADC). The following findings are in support of the decision to approve this application. For more information or questions, please contact Alyssa Schrems, project planner.

REVIEW CRITERIA (ADC 7.120)

The Director will approve residential alteration requests if one of the following criteria is met:

- a. There is no change in historic character, appearance, or material composition from the existing structure.
- b. The proposed alteration materially duplicates the affected exterior building features as determined from an early photograph, original building plans, or other evidence of original building features.
- c. The proposed alteration is not visible from the street.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The residential structure located at 805 5th Avenue SW is identified as contributing within the Monteith National Register Historic District. The subject property measures about 7,878 square feet and is located on the north side of 5th Avenue SW. The property is within the Hackleman Monteith (HM) zoning district (Attachment A). Per the Albany Historic Resource Survey, the house was constructed circa 1896 in the Italianate style. Identified features include Eastlake turned columns, brackets on the front porch, decorative brackets under the extended eaves, two story rectangular bays with windows on the east and west sides, and a wide frieze board (Attachment B).
- 2. On the northern side of the house (not visible from 5th Avenue SW, the applicant proposes to install a central A/C unit, as well as to add a back door with associated landing deck and stairs. The proposed changes will all be in the rear yard behind an existing six-foot privacy fence.

3. Application materials include written findings and a site plan showing the proposed location of the changes (Attachment C).

CONCLUSION

- 1. Only one of the review criteria in ADC 7.120(1) must be met for the proposed alterations to be approved.
- 2. The proposed alteration is not visible from the street.
- 3. This application satisfies the review criteria for a director-level decision based on compliance with ADC 7.120(1) and is approved with the following conditions.

CONDITIONS

Condition 1 The proposed work will not deviate from the approved plan.

Condition 2 All work shall be completed in accordance with the applicable building code requirements. Building permits may be required, please reach out to Building Inspection at 541-917-7550 for further assistance.

A final historic inspection is required to verify that the work has been done according to this application. Please call the historic planner (541-791-0176) a day or two in advance to schedule.



Death of LAWRENCE COUGILE - Lawrence Cougill, only son of Fr. & Frs. Attachment Beill, died last evening about 5 c'clock of spinal meningitis, after an illness of only three days. After a ride he was taken ill and nothing could be done to save him.

He was born in Albany May 3, 1890, and spent his life in and around Albany, part of the time residing on Mr. Cougill's farm. He was a boy of excellent habits, well liked, and the parents have the sympathy of all in their loss.

The funeral service will be held at the M. E. Church tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Death Claims a Local Pioneer - JOSEPH BENSON COUGILL, 81, a resident of Albany for more than 40 years, died at his home at 805 West Fifth Street at 5 o'clock this morning following an illness of but a few days. Mr. Cougill was born in the state of Indiana, June 15, 1847, and when but a mere child moved with his parents to Shelby-ville, Illinois, where the family resided until about the close of the great civil war.

In 1866 he moved to Kansas where he took up a prairie homestead and farmed until 1876 when he came to Oregon. He first located at Mt. Tabor in East Portland where with his brother, Wesley Cougill, he followed the carpenter and contracting business for several years. From Portland, with his family, he moved to Benton county in 1883 locating on a farm he purchased in the Palestine neighborhood, moving to Albany in 1885 where he has since made his home. For many years he followed the contracting business in Albany and vicinity. Among the larger buildings he has constructed in Albany are the United Presbyterian and Methodist Church buildings, and the two storey brick building now occupied by the Stiff Furniture Company at the corner of Second and Eroadalbin streets.

Many residences in the city are the products of his workmanship.

Mr. Cougill was united in marriage to Miss Mary Eliza Westerfield in the state of Kansas, July 27, 1873. Beside his widow he is survived by an only daughter, Emma Retta, now Mrs. N. M. Newport, of Lebanon.

Lawrence Vincent Cougill the only son, died in Albany in 1907 at the age of 17 years. He is also survived by two granddaughters, Mrs. Beatrice Tate of Eugene and Mrs. Mary Louise Groves of Lebanon and a great grandson, James Monroe Tate also of Eugene. He is survived by one brother, George Cougill, of Illinois.

Mr. Cougill was a devout member of the Methodist church serving in the capacity of an officer and teacher of the men's Bible class in the Sunday School for many years, and widely known as a Christian man of positive character.

Funeral services will be held at the Methodist Church beginning at 2 c'clock Wednesday afternoon conducted by Dr. D. H. Leech, pastor of the church of which he was a member, assisted by Dr. Wallace Howe Lee, of Albany College. Burial will be in the Riverside cemetery. - Albany Democrat-Herald, 1 Jan. 1929, p. 1.

Hector of Albany are cousins.
