Ordinance No 161.

An Ordinance defining and Prescribing
the duties and Qualifications, and
fixing the Compensation of the City
Treasurer.

The People of the City of Albany
do Ordain as follows:

Section 1. Before entering upon the duties
of his office, the City Treasurer shall file
with the City Recorder a certificate of
his election with his oath of office
as prescribed by the City Charter endorsed
thereon, and also a bond payable to the
City of Albany in such sum as the City
Council may require, payable in Gold
Coin of the United States of America,
with two or more sureties, who shall
justify in double the penalty in the bond
and to be approved by the Mayor, con-
ditioned that he will faithfully and
discharge the duties of his office as
City Treasurer, account for and pay
over all money, and turn over to his

Successor in office all books, papers, or property, belong to the city that may come into his hands by virtue of his office as such Treasurer.

Section 2. The Treasurer shall keep an office at some convenient place in the city and shall pay all orders, by order of the Council, issued to him by the City Recorder in the order in which they are presented for payment, from the funds of the City Treasury, and he shall pay no money out of the Treasury except upon orders issued by the Recorder.

Section 3. He shall at the end of each quarter, namely the 31st of March, 30th of June, 30th of September, and 31st of December, and at the last regular meeting of the year, or at any time when required by the City Council so to do, report to the City Council his doings as Treasurer, and at the time of making such report return to the City Council all vouchers paid and cancelled by him, which cancelling shall be done by writing or stamping on the face of such order the word "Paid" in large letters with the date of payment. He shall include in his report an account of all money and property in his hands as City Treasurer, and turn the same to his Successor in office, when he shall be duly qualified.

Section 4. When any City Warrant shall be presented to the City Treasurer and there is no money in the Treasury to pay the same, the City Treasurer shall endorse on the back of said warrant, "Presented and not paid

for want of funds," also the time of making such endorsement; and he shall keep a record of such orders or warrants in a book kept for that purpose; whenever the City Treasurer shall pay any warrant so endorsed he shall cancel the same, as other warrants are cancelled by him, and enter the same in the book of endorsed orders.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the City Treasurer to keep all money collected for road tax and paid over to him by the Street Commissioner, separate and apart from the general fund, and such money shall be known as the "Street improvement" fund. He shall also keep a book to be known as the "Street improvement fund book," in which he shall enter the amount of money paid to him belong to said fund, and the date when paid, and also the amount paid out by him from said fund by order of the Council, the person to whom paid, the number of the order, and the date of payment. He shall pay no money out of said fund except upon an order specially drawn upon said fund by order of the Council and signed by the City Recorder.

Section 6. The City Treasurer shall receive as his salary, the sum of \$10000 per annum, which shall be paid quarterly out of the treasury the same as other claims against the City are paid.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any this

Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 8th. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its approval by the Mayor.
