

Ordinance No 163,  
An Ordinance to regulate Laundries and  
Wash houses, and to exclude them from  
certain portions of the City of Albany.

The People of the City of Albany do  
ordain as follows:

Section I. That it shall be unlawful for  
any person or persons to open or carry on, or  
cause to be opened or carried on, on First  
Street between Washington Street and Baker  
Street in the City of Albany, any wash house  
or Laundry, or any place where washing is  
done for hire.

Section II. If any person or persons shall  
open and carry on or cause to be opened or  
carried on, on First Street between Washington  
Street and Baker Street in said City, any  
Laundry, wash house or place where washing  
is done for hire, such person or persons shall  
upon conviction thereof before the Recorder  
of the City of Albany, be punished by a fine of  
not less than five dollars nor more  
than thirty dollars, or by imprisonment in  
the City Jail for not less than two days nor  
more than fifteen days or by both such  
fine and imprisonment at the discretion of  
the Court.

Section III. This Ordinance, if approved by  
the Mayor, shall take effect and be in  
full force from and after the first day of  
January 1888.
