

Ordinance Number 199.

For and
An ordinance granting to the Sunset Tel and Tel. Co for the purpose of maintaining and operating a Telephone plant, the right to erect poles and thereon to suspend wires in ^{the} streets and thoroughfares of the City of Albany.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1: The Sunset Telephone and Telegraph Company, a Corporation duly incorporated under the laws of the State of California, is hereby granted the right, and ~~are~~ hereby authorized to erect and maintain Telephone poles upon and to run wires over and along the public streets and thoroughfares of said City under the provisions of Section 2 of this Ordinance.

Section 2: That the Sunset Telephone and Telegraph Company, a Corporation duly incorporated under the laws of

Section 3: That the said poles shall be constructed and erected in a neat and workmanlike manner, such poles shall not be less than thirty feet high, eight inches at the bottom and four inches at top; and shall be set not less than four feet in the ground and shall be so placed as to render them safe from all danger of careening or falling and said poles shall be placed, under the direction of the Superintendent of streets, or other like officer of the City so as not to interfere with any object lawfully.

existing in the said streets or alleys.

Section 3: That whenever it shall be necessary in the erection of said poles, to take up any portion of the sidewalk, or dig up the ground at the sides of or corners of said streets or alleys, then the said Company, its successors or assigns, shall, after said poles are erected, without delay, remove any debris that may have been placed there in the erection of said poles, and shall put such sidewalk, street or alley in as good condition as it was before the same was taken up or disturbed.

Section 4: The City Council hereby reserves the right to use said Telephone poles for Fire Alarm purposes.

Section 5: That when any person has obtained permission to use any of the streets of the City for the purpose of removing any building, the said Company, its successors or assigns, upon forty eight hours notice from such person, shall raise or remove any of said wires which may obstruct the removal of such buildings, so as to allow the free and unobstructed passage of the same; such notice shall be in writing and served by any person competent to be a witness in a civil action against said Company, its successors or assigns, for the purpose aforesaid.

Section 6: That said Company its successors or assigns, shall begin the construction of its plant within sixty (60) days and have the same in operation within One Hundred

(100) days from the passage of this ordinance:
 Provided that unless the provisions in this
 section are not complied with, this ordinance
 shall be void and of no effect.

Section 7: That if any person or persons shall wilfully
 or carelessly injure or destroy any portion
 of the works or fixtures or other property of
 said Telephone Co.; he shall be declared
 guilty of a misdemeanor and upon
 conviction thereof be fined not to exceed
 one hundred dollars.

Section 8: That the City of Albany hereby reserves
 the right to alter, change or modify
 this ordinance or any of its provisions,
 having due regard to the rights of
 said Sunset Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Section 9: That this ordinance shall take effect
 and be in force from and after its passage
 by the Council and approval by the
 Mayor.
