An Ordinance to regulate the use of Water from the Water works, during the time of fire.

The People of the City of Albany, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That upon an alarm of fire being given, it shall be, and is hereby made the duty of any, and all persons, residing, or taking water from the pipes of the Albany, Canal, Water, Transportation, and Light Company of Albany, Oregon, to immediately shut off the flow of water from all hydrants, faucets, water closets, bath rooms, or other places on their respective premises, where water is used, and to keep the same shut off, (except when it is absolutely necessary to use water), until the fire is extinguished, and the further use of water for fire purposes is not required. Any person, or persons, failing, neglecting, or refusing to comply with the provisions of this section, or in any way violating the same, shall upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court of said City, be fined not less than five dollars, or more than twenty dollars, or imprisoned in the City Jail not less than two days, or more than ten days.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force from and after its approval by the Mayor.
