

Ord No

An ordinance granting to The First National Bank of Albany, Oregon, the use of a certain portion of First Street to erect and maintain a drinking fountain.

Whereas The First National Bank of Albany, Oregon has asked permission of the council to erect and maintain for public use, a cast bronze drinking fountain on the South side of First Street near the outer edge of the sidewalk and about fifteen feet west of the West curb line of Broadalbin Street; and

Whereas said drinking fountain will be a public benefit.

Therefore

The People of the City of Albany Do Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. The right is hereby granted to The First National Bank of Albany, Oregon to erect and maintain a cast bronze public drinking fountain on the South side of First Street near the outer edge of the sidewalk and about fifteen feet west of the West curb line of Broadalbin Street; provided, however, should the said drinking fountain cease to be used as a public drinking fountain or fail to be supplied with water, then the same upon demand of the council of the City of Albany, shall be forthwith removed and the sidewalk placed in the same condition as the adjoining sidewalk now is.
