

ORDINANCE No. 988.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND RECORDER OF THE CITY OF ALBANY OREGON, TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH GEORGE H. BOOM AND C.E. DAVIS, CO-PARTNERS, OPERATING AND DOING BUSINESS UNDER THE FIRM NAME OF BOOM AND DAVIS, FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF TENTH STREET FROM THE WEST LINE OF ELM STREET TO THE EAST LINE OF COTTAGE STREET.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 980 of the City of Albany, Oregon, it was ordered that the following street in the City of Albany, Oregon, to-wit: Tenth Street from the West line of Elm Street to the east line of Cottage Street, be improved in the following manner to-wit:

First: by grading said street to the proper grade.

Second: By graveling said street.

Said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and Ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer then on file with the Recorder of the City of Albany; and

WHEREAS, it was provided in said ordinance that the Recorder of the City of Albany give notice for bids for the making of said improvement in the manner provided by law and by said ordinance; and

WHEREAS, after due notice and advertisement for bids made and given by the Recorder of the City of Albany according to law and the Ordinance Last aforesaid, to-wit: on the 27th day of April, 1921, George H. Boom and C.E. Davis, co-partners, presented to the Council of the City of Albany, its bid for making said improvement, which bid was made in due form and in conformity with all the conditions imposed by the law and the Council, by which said bid George H. Boom and C.E. Davis, co-partners, proposed to furnish all material and implements and perform the labor necessary to make the above described improvement for the following named prices, to-wit:

Excavation, per cubic yard,	\$ 0.80
Fill, per cubic yard in excess	0.80
Crushed gravel per yard	2.50
Estimated total	687.00

AND WHEREAS, the said George H. Boom and C.E. Davis, co-partners, was the lowest bidder for said proposed work and said bid was the lowest and best bid therefor.

Section 1. That the bid of George H. Boom and C.E. Davis, co-partners for said improvement of said described portion of Tenth Street be and the same is hereby accepted and the Mayor and Recorder of said city are hereby authorized to enter into a contract in writing with the said George H. Boom and C.E. Davis, co-partners, for the making of said improvement on behalf of the City of Albany, Oregon upon the terms in said bid hereinabove mentioned.

Said contract to provide further that the work of said improvement shall commence within ten days after the signing of said contract and shall be prosecuted with such vigor that all the work embraced in said contract shall be entirely completed on or before the first day of August, 1921 and the City of Albany, Ore-

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gon, shall be deemed to suffer damages to the extent of \$ 10.00 per day for each and every day the work is delayed beyond said specified time, and that the said George H. Boom and C. E. Davis, co-partners furnish a bond in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to be approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany, Oregon having as a surety some surety Company authorized to do business in the State of Oregon, conditioned for the faithful performance of the said contract on the part of George H. Boom and C. E. Davis, co-partners and further indemnifying the City of Albany against any claim or lien for labor, work or material on the part of any person, firm or corporation arising out of said contract.


