

## ORDINANCE NO. 1010.

AN ORDINANCE TO ASCERTAIN AND DETERMINE THE PROBABLE COST OF CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS WHICH THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALBANY, OREGON, HAS DETERMINED IN RESOLUTION NO. 16, ADOPTED BY SAID COUNCIL ON THE 8th DAY OF JUNE, 1921, TO MAKE ON THE ALLEY BETWEEN THIRD STREET AND FOURTH STREET THROUGH BLOCK NO. 19 IN THE CITY OF ALBANY, OREGON; TO ASCERTAIN, ASSESS, DETERMINE AND DECLARE THE PROPORTIONATE SHARE OF SUCH PROBABLE COST OF SUCH IMPROVEMENT OF SAID ALLEY THAT IS ASSESSED UPON EACH LOT OR PART THEREOF ADJACENT TO SAID PART OF SAID ALLEY TO BE SO IMPROVED; TO DIRECT THE RECORDER OF THE SAID CITY TO ENTER A STATEMENT OF SUCH ASSESSMENT IN THE DOCKET OF CITY LIENS AS PROVIDED BY THE CHARTER OF SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, on the 25th day of May, 1921 the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon duly adopted a Resolution requiring the City Engineer to make plans, and specifications for the improvement of the Alley between Third Street and Fourth Street through Block No. 19 in the following manner, to-wit:

- First: By grading said Alley to the proper sub-grade.
- Second: By paving the roadway of said alley full width with asphaltic concrete pavement on an asphaltic concrete foundation, or by paving said Alley with Portland cement concrete pavement, or by paving with Warrenite bitolithic wearing surface upon a bituminous concrete base at the option of the Council.
- Third: By laying six inch sewer pipe.
- Fourth: By constructing inlets.
- Fifth: By constructing wooden headers.

And for the estimates of the work to be done on the said portion of the Alley and the probable cost thereof and requiring that such plans, specifications, estimates and probable cost be filed in the Recorder's office of said City, said Resolution being endorsed "Resolution No. 14" and adopted on the 25th day of May, 1921; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer of said City of Albany, pursuant to said Resolution No. 14 made plans, specifications and estimates as directed by said Resolution for the improvement of said Alley in the manner specified in said Resolution No. 14 and filed said plans, specifications and estimates in the Recorder's office in said City on the 8th day of June, 1921; and

WHEREAS, the said Council on the 8th day of June, 1921, by Resolution No. 16, duly adopted by said Council, determined and resolved that it deemed it expedient and that said council proposed to improve the Alley between Third Street and Fourth Street through Block No. 19 in the manner provided in said Resolution No. 16; and

WHEREAS, in and by Resolution No. 16 adopted as aforesaid by the Council, the Recorder of said City was duly ordered and directed by said Council to give notice of said proposed improvement of said Alley between Third Street and Fourth Street as provided by the charter of said City; and

WHEREAS, the Recorder in pursuance of said order and direction of said City of Albany did duly give notice of said proposed improvement of said Alley in the manner provided by the charter of said city; and

WHEREAS, the said Council in and by said Resolution No. 22 adopted on July 15th, 1921, did select Asphaltic concrete pavement on an Asphaltic concrete found-

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dation as the most advantageous kind of pavement to be used in the making of said improvement as aforesaid; and

WHEREAS, the said Council in and by said Resolution No. 16 ascertained and determined the total probable cost of making said improvement of said Alley to be paid by the owners of the real property adjacent to said portion of said Alley to be improved as specified in said Resolution No. 16 to be the sum of \$ 1837.50.

## T H E R E F O R E

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Alley in the City of Albany, Oregon, between Third Street and Fourth Street through Block No. 19 shall be improved as follows:

- First : By grading said alley to the proper subgrade.
- Second : By paving the roadway of said Alley full width with Asphaltic concrete pavement on an asphaltic concrete foundation.
- Third: By laying six inch sewer pipe.
- Fourth: By constructing inlets.
- Fifth : By constructing wooden headers.

All in accordance with said Resolution No. 16 and Resolution No. 22 and the plans and specifications for the improvement filed by the City Engineer with the Recorder of said City of Albany on the 8th day of June, 1921.

Section 2. That the probable cost of making said improvement of said Alley in the City of Albany, Oregon, between Third Street and Fourth Street through Block No. 19 in the manner heretofore determined by the Council of the said City of Albany in and by Resolution No. 16 with asphaltic concrete pavement, Portland cement concrete pavement, or Warrenite bitulithic pavement at the option of the Council to be paid by the owners of the real property adjacent to said portion of the Alley is hereby declared to be the sum of \$ 1837.50.

Section 3. That the proportionate share of said cost of said improvement of said Alley assessed upon each lot or part thereof adjacent to said part of the Alley to be improved as aforesaid and determined by said Council in and by said Resolution No. 16 is hereby ascertained and declared to be the sum set and placed immediately after the separate description of each of such lots or parts thereof as follows:

Lot No. 3 in Block No. 19 in the City of Albany, Oregon.  
87 3/20 feet on the Alley. Assessed at \$ 229.69.

Hart Margaret M.

Lot No. 4 in Block No. 19 in the City of Albany, Oregon.  
87 3/20 feet on Alley. Assessed at \$ 229.69

Sullivan Maggie C. (C. G. Cleek, Agt.)

Lot No. 5 of Block No. 19 in the City of Albany, Oregon.  
87 3/20 feet on Alley Assessed at \$ 229.69.

Lillard Caroline M.

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Lot No. 6 in Block No. 19 in the City of Albany, Oregon.  
67 3/20 feet on Alley.

Assessed at \$ 229.69.

Anderson Elliot C. & Addie

Beginning at S.E. corner of Lot No. 7 in Block No. 19 in the City of Albany, Oregon, thence W. 31 feet thence N. 50 feet thence E. 6 feet, thence n. 50 feet thence E. 45 feet thence S. 100 feet to beg. the boundary lines of said premises to run parrallel with boundary lines of said block.


