## ORDINANCE NO. 1379

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH AND DEFINE the Fire Limits of the City of Albany. Oregon, and to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBARY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The fire limits of the City of Albany, Oregon, shall be bounded by a line commencing at a point where the center line of Calapooia Street intersects the south bank of the Willamette River, and running thence southerly following the center line of said Calapooia Street to the center line of the alley between Third and Fourth Streets; thence easterly along the center line of said alley to the center line of Ferry Street; thence southerly along the center line of Ferry Street to the center line of Fourth Street; thence easterly following the center line of Fourth Street to a point 67.8 feet easterly from the east line of Lyon Street; thence northerly parallel with the east line of Lyon Street to the center of Third Street; thence easterly following the center line of Third Street to the center line of Montgomery Street; thence northerly along the center line of Montgomery the south bank of the Willamette River; thence westerly along the south bank of the Willamette River to the place of beginning.

Section 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
