

## ORDINANCE NO. 1421

AN ORDINANCE providing for the time and manner of vacating Broadalbin Street from the South line of Fourth Street to the North line of Fifth Street in the City of Albany, Oregon, and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, it is contemplated by the County Court of Linn County, Oregon, that a new Court House for said County be constructed upon blocks 28 and 29 in said City and upon that portion of Broadalbin Street lying between the South line of Fourth Street and the North line of Fifth Street; and

Whereas, the County Court of Linn County, Oregon, is now engaged in the preparation of its preliminary plans and specifications for a new Court House, and in the acquisition of suitable property for the site of the same in the City of Albany; and

Whereas, the Mayor and Council of said City deem it expedient and of advantage to the City of Albany, and to Linn County in general that Broadalbin Street, between the South line of Fourth Street and the North line of Fifth Street be vacated in Order that said portion of said Street may be utilized by Linn County, Oregon for a portion of the building site for said Court House; and

Whereas, the Mayor and Council of said City deem it expedient and necessary that said portion of said Street be vacated.

THEREFORE:\*

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, shall proceed to vacate Broadalbin Street from the South line of Fourth Street to the North line of Fifth Street in the City of Albany, Oregon, in the manner provided by law.

Section 2. The Recorder of the City of Albany, Oregon, shall give notice of the vacation of said portion of said Street by publishing the same in the Albany Democrat Herald, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Albany, Oregon, once each week for four successive weeks, which said notice shall describe the portion of said Street herein contemplated to be vacated and which said notice shall state that the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, will on the 31st day of May, 1937, at ten o'clock A.M. of said day at the City Recorder's office in the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, hear objections or remonstrances to the vacation of said portion of said Street by any person or persons interested therein. The Recorder of said City within five days after the first publication of said notice shall post or cause to be posted at or near each end of said proposed vacation a copy of said notice which shall be headed "Notice of Street Vacation", and such notice shall also be posted in at least two conspicuous places in said proposed vacation of said street. The posting and first day of publication of such notice shall not be less than twenty-eight days before the time of such hearing.

Section 3. Whereas, the peace, health and safety of the City of Albany requires that this Ordinance shall become immediately effective, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared and this Ordinance shall become in full force and effect immediately upon its final passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
