

ORDINANCE NO. 2619

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF OF POLICE TO DESIGNATE HAZARDOUS INTERSECTIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE MARKING THEREOF; PROVIDING THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION HEREOF; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EMERGENCY

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to designate hazardous intersections within the City of Albany.

Section 2: Upon the finding by the Chief of Police that an intersection is hazardous, he shall notify the police department, the City Manager, the City Recorder and the Street Superintendent of his findings in writing.

Section 3: Upon receiving notice from the Chief of Police as above provided the Street Superintendent shall mark off the intersection by painting the curbing yellow a distance of 20 feet from the cross walk.

Section 4: After the intersection is so marked, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to park any vehicle in the area adjacent to the curbing so marked.

Section 5: Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof in the Municipal Court, shall be fined not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$100.00 or by confinement in the City Jail for a period not to exceed 10 days.

Section 6: The above ordinance affects the peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Albany and its immediate passage is necessary, therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be immediately effective upon its passage by the council and approval by the Mayor.
