AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A PARKING COMMISSION AND DESCRIBING THE DUTIES THEREOF.

## RECITALS:

The parking problem has become more and more accuts with the influx of population and increase of vehicular travel. To properly attract retail trade to the City of Albany, while preserving, as near as possible, individual property rights, and in order to facilitate free movement of traffic to and from the various parts of the City of Albany, the Council has determined the matter is of sufficient importance for specialized study. In an attempt to work out the complex parking problems which includes off street parking, limited zone parking, loading zones and the movement of traffic to and from various parts in the city and discharging their cargo upon arrival, the council has proposed a parking commission as a recommending body to study and advise the council.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: There is hereby created a Parking Commission consisting of seven (7) members which shall be appointed by the Mayor, with the approval of the council to serve at the pleasure of the council.

Section 2: The Parking Commission shall study the overall parking problem of the City of Albany and shall report to the council from time to time of its findings and recommendations.

All matters concerning parking shall be referred to the Parking Commission for recommendation before being brought to the council for final decision.

Section 3: In order to provide proper liaison between the Planning and Zoning Commission and the City Council and the Parking Commission, nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as restricting members of the other two bodies when serving on the Parking Commission.
