"AN ACT to provide a special continuing levy of \$7,500.00 per year for the fiscal year 1963-64 and \$7,500.00 per year for each of the next nine (9) years to provide for the maintenance of a community center building within the City of Albany. This levy shall be outside of the 6% limitation set forth in Section 2 of Article XI of the Oregon Constitution."

AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: SPECIAL ELECTION CALLED.

TITLE:

That in the manner provided by law and in this Ordinance, and for the purpose set forth herein, a special election shall be held in the City of Albany, Oregon, on the 18th day of September, 1963, commencing at the hour of 8:00 a.m. and continuing until the hour of 8:00 p.m. of the said day.

Section 2: DESIGNATION OF POLLING PLACES, POLLING BOOKS AND JUDGES

The polling places hereby are designated as follows:

ward	One	 Maple School	
Ward	Two	City Hall	
Ward	Three	 Waverly School	

The City Recorder shall prepare the poll books for the election and the judges and clerks of the election shall be appointed by the City Recorder with the consent of the council.

Section 3: HOURS OF ELECTION

The polls for the special city election shall be open in each of the polling places at 8:00 a.m. and shall be kept open until 8:00 p.m.

Section 4: NOTICE OF ELECTION

Notice of the election shall be given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Albany not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days before the election. Notice of the election shall be posted for not less than twenty (20) days before the election in three (3) public places within the city. Notice in the newspaper and those posted shall be substantially in the following form:

"NOTICE OF ELECTION

On the 18th day of September, 1963, in the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, at 8 o'clock a.m. until 8 o'clock p.m., a special election shall be held at which the following measure shall be submitted to the voters for their approval:

> SPECIAL CONTINUING TAX LEVY FOR COMMUNITY CENTER BUILDING MAINTENANCE

Shall the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, levy a special continuing ten (10) year levy of \$7,500.00 for the fiscal year 1963-64 and \$7,500.00 per year for each of the next nine (9) years outside of the 6% limitation as provided in the Oregon Constitution, Section 2, Article XI'
