ORDINANCE NO. 3118

AN ORDINANCE TO GOVERN, CONTROL AND PREVENT THE SALE, OFFERING FOR SALE, BARTER OR GIVING AWAY BABY CHICKENS, DUCKLINGS, OR OTHER FOWL UNDER THREE (3) WEEKS OF AGE OR RABBITS UNDER TWO (2) MONTHS OF AGE AS PETS, TOYS, PREMIUMS OR NOVELTIES.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: SALES, BARTERING, ETC. PROHIBITED

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell, offer for sale, barter or give away baby chickens, ducklings or other fowl under three (3) weeks of age or rabbits under two (2) months of age as pets, toys, premiums or novelties, or to color, dye, stain or otherwise change the natural color of baby chickens, ducklings or rabbits, provided, however, that this ordinance shall not be construed to prohibit the sale or displaying for the sale of baby chickens, ducklings or other fowl or such rabbits, in public facilities by breeders or stores engaged in the business of selling for purposes of commercial breeding and raising. Section 2: VIOLATION -- PENALTIES

Violation of this ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor and any firm, person or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not to exceed ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) or imprisonment in the city jail for a period of not to exceed thirty (30) days.
