ORDINANCE NO. 4483

TITLE:

An Ordinance providing for the calling of a special election in the City of Albany on May 18, 1982 for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of the City of Albany, Oregon, a Charter Amendment designating the City Manager as Purchasing Agent subject to rules as enacted by the City Council and further amending the Charter providing the manner in which ordinances are introduced, read and passed and declaring an emergency.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Special Election Called.

The propositions set forth in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be submitted in the manner prescribed in this Ordinance to the legal voters of the City of Albany, Oregon, a special election to be held on the 18th day of May, 1982. There is a state-wide primary election being held in the State of Oregon and in the City of Albany and as a part thereof on the 18th day of May, 1982, this special election is called to be held concurrently therewith.

Section 2. Propositions to be Voted.

At the election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Albany for their approval or rejection the following propositions:

Proposition 1. Shall the Charter of the City of Albany be amended as to Section 22(C)(4) to read as follows:

"The powers and duties of the City Manager are as follows: He shall act as purchasing agent for all departments of the City. All purchases shall be made pursuant to those requirements and regulations as shall be set forth in Ordinance adopted by the City Council."

Proposition 2. Shall Section 38 of the Charter of the City of Albany be amended to read as follows:

- "(1) Except as subsection (3) of this section provides for reading by title only and except as subsection (2) of this section provides for immediate adoption of emergency measures, an ordinance, before being adopted, shall be fully and distinctly read in open council meeting on two (2) days.
- (2) Except as subsection (3) of this section provides for reading by title only, an ordinance necessary to meet an emergency may, upon being read in full and then by title, be adopted at a single meeting of the council by a unanimous vote of all councillors present.
- (3) A reading of any ordinance for purposes of adoption may be by title only--

- a. If no councillor present at the meeting requests that the ordinance be read in full, or,
- b. If for one week prior to the reading a copy of the ordinance is provided to each councillor, and copies are available for public inspection at the office of the City Manager during regular office hours, and notice of their availability is posted at the City Hall or published once in a newspaper of general circulation in the City.

Section 3. Designation of Polling Places, Poll Books and Judges.

The regular polling places designated by the County Clerk of Linn County, Oregon, and Benton County, Oregon, in each voting precinct in the City of Albany are hereby designated as the polling places for the special city election. The poll books adopted by the County Clerk of Linn County, Oregon, and Benton County, Oregon, as the poll books for the state-wide general election for the voting precincts in the City of Albany are hereby adopted as the poll books for the special city election. The judges and clerks of election appointed by the County Clerk of Linn County, Oregon, and Benton County, Oregon, to serve at the state-wide general election hereby are designated as the judges and clerks of and for the special city election.

Section 4. Hours of Election.

The polls for the special city election shall be open in each of the voting precincts at the same hour, and should be kept open until the same hour, as the polls are opened and closed for the statewide general election that will be held on the same day.

Section 5. Notice of Election.

Notice of election shall be given by publication twice in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Albany, Oregon, not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days before the election. Notices of the election shall be posted for not less than twenty (20) days before the election in three (3) public places within the city. The notice in the newspaper and those posted in three (3) public places shall be in substantially the following form:

"NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

"On the 18th day of May, 1982, in the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, and Benton County, Oregon, from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. a special election will be held at which the following measures will be submitted to the voters for their approval:

SHALL THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF ALBANY be amended as to Section 22(C)(4) to read as follows:

"The powers and duties of the City Manager are as follows: He shall act as purchasing agent for all departments of the City. All purchases shall

be made pursuant to those requirements and regulations as shall be set forth in Ordinance adopted by the City Council."

SHALL SECTION 38 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF ALBANY be amended to read as follows:

- "(1) Except as subsection (3) of this section provides for reading by title only and except as subsection (2) of this section provides for immediate adoption of emergency measures, an ordinance, before being adopted, shall be fully and distinctly read in open council meeting on two (2) days.
- (2) Except as subsection (3) of this section provides for reading by title only, an ordinance necessary to meet an emergency may, upon being read in full and then by title, be adopted at a single meeting of the council by a unanimous vote of all councillors present.
- (3) A reading of any ordinance for purposes of adoption may be by title only-
 - a. If no councillor present at the meeting requests that the ordinance be read in full, or,
 - b. If for one week prior to the reading a copy of the ordinance is provided to each councillor, and copies are available for public inspection at the office of the City Manager during regular office hours, and notice of their availability is posted at the City Hall or published once in a newspaper of general circulation in the City."

The recorder shall advertise and post or cause to be posted the notice as required by this section. The notice of election required to be given by this ordinance shall constitute the only notice necessary and all ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith shall not apply to the notices required to be give of this election.

Section 6. Ballot Form.
