ORDINANCE NO.5008

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 5006, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That Ordinance No. 5006, Sections 2, 7 & 9 are amended as follows:

<u>Section 2</u>: <u>Form of Question</u>. At the Levy election, there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the city of Albany, for their approval or rejection the following question:

"Shall City of Albany levy \$.58 58 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value valuation for Parks and Recreation operations for three years beginning 1993-94?"

This measure would establish a three year tax rate serial levy to maintain and improve parks and recreation services within the city of Albany. It is estimated that a levy of \$.58 per \$1,000 of assessed value would provide \$524,100 in 1993-94, \$555,000 in 1994 95, and \$588,900 in 1995 96. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of estimate. This levy replaces the existing parks and recreation serial levy which expires June 30, 1993. This levy is a three-year tax rate serial levy to continue and maintain parks and recreation services within the city of Albany. It is estimated that a levy of 58 cents per \$1,000 valuation would provide \$524,100 in 1993-94, \$555,500 in 1994-95 and \$588,900 in 1995-96. This levy will not raise property taxes above the \$10 Ballot Measure 5 property tax limit. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of estimate.

<u>Section 7</u>: <u>Ballot Form</u>. The following is the form in which the question shall be printed on the official ballot:

RENEWAL OF THREE-YEAR PARKS AND RECREATION OPERATING SERIAL LEVY

"Shall City of Albany levy \$.58 58 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value valuation for Parks and Recreation operations for three years beginning 1993-94?"

This measure would establish a three year tax rate serial levy to maintain and improve parks and recreation services within the city of Albany. It is estimated that a levy of \$.58 per \$1,000 of assessed value would provide \$524,100 in 1993-94, \$555,000 in 1994-95, and \$588,900 in 1995-96. This levy is within the \$10 Ballot Measure 5 property tax limit and will not raise property taxes above the \$10-limit. This levy will replace the existing parks and recreation three year serial levy which expires June 30, 1993. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of estimate.

The following services will be provided annually by this levy; Swanson Pool operation, \$22,300; Albany Senior Center programs, \$55,000; teen programs, \$30,500; neighborhood park maintenance and turf care, \$217,000; park renovation and capital improvements, \$18,800; recreation programs, \$12,600; Albany Community Pool operation, \$87,700; youth programs at the Boys' and Cirls' Club, \$50,000; therapeutic programs at the YMCA, \$30,000.

This levy replaces the existing parks and recreation serial levy which expires June 30, 1993. This levy is a three-year tax rate levy to continue parks and recreation services within the city of Albany. It is estimated that a levy of 58 cents per \$1,000 valuation would provide \$524,100 in 1993-94, \$555,500 in 1994-95 and \$588,900 in 1995-96. This levy will not raise property taxes above the \$10 Ballot Measure 5 property tax limit. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of estimate. Approval of this levy would reduce the property tax collections of other nonschool district units of local government available under the provisions of Section 11b, Article XI, Oregon Constitution and implementing legislation.

In the first year of the levy, the following services will be provided: Community Pool operation, \$87,700; youth programs at the Boys and Girls Club, \$50,000; Senior Center programs, \$55,000; teen programs, \$30,500; park maintenance \$217,000; park renovation and capital improvements, \$18,800; recreation programs, \$12,600; therapeutic programs at the YMCA, \$30,000; Swanson Pool operation, \$22,500. Future amounts for each activity will be set by the Albany Budget Committee.

<u>Section 9</u>: <u>Emergency Clause</u>. WHEREAS, it is in the betterment of the public health, interest, safety, and general welfare of the city of Albany, Oregon, that this matter be disposed of at the earliest possible moment, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall become immediately effective upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
