## RESOLUTION NO. 385

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, that the following be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Albany, Oregon, as a special continuing tax levy on all taxable property within the city limits of the City of Albany, Oregon, for the purpose of providing storm sewers and drainage, for a period of ten (10) years beginning with the tax year 1957-1958 in the sum of \$85,000.00 annually, said sum to be outside of the limitation imposed by Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution.

The proposition shall be submitted at the regular general election to be held November 6, 1956.

The ballot title of the measure submitted shall be as follows:

"Shall The Proposed Continuing Tax Levy Be Adopted?"

The summary of the measure that shall appear with
the title shall be as follows:

"Shall the City of Albany levy annually, beginning July 1, 1957, and continuing for a period of ten years, a special tax levy of \$85,000.00 annually, to provide a fund for storm sewer and drainage construction within and without the city, said tax levy to be outside of the limitation imposed by Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution."

The City Recorder is hereby directed to certify the said measure to the County Clerk of Linn County not more than seventy (70) nor less than sixty-five (65) days before the general election by transmitting a certified duplicate of the proposal to the County Clerk by registered mail. The City Recorder is further directed to post a certified duplicate copy of the measure in his office for a like length of time prior to the general election.

The City Recorder is further directed to prepare a pamphlet containing a true copy of the ballot title and the test of the measure and mail a copy thereof to each voter in the city whose address he may have not later than the fifth day before the day of the election at which the said measure is to be voted upon.

Preceding such measure shall be a statement that the same will be submitted to the legal voters at a regular election on November 6, 1956.
