WHEREAS Pan American World Airways and Northwest Airlines have both been providing air service between Hawaii and Portland and Seattle on the basis of temporary certificates from the Civil Aeronautics Administration, and

WHEREAS hearings are about to be held in Washington, D. C. concerning the continuance of such service by only Northwest Airlines, and

WHEREAS the Pacific Northwest urgently needs freight and passenger service to and from Hawaii, and

WHEREAS many of the cities of Oregon and of the Northwest are in a rapidly growing and developing area of the country and afford markets and destination for a large segment of Hawaiian produce and commerce and are ever more rapidly increasing the flow of goods and persons to Hawaii from this area so that direct air service is a commercial necessity, and

WHEREAS, the expanding commercial air service needs of the Pacific Northwest can best be carried out by the operation of free and open competition between the two carriers rather than by the certification of only Northwest Airlines, and

WHEREAS the State of Oregon, Portland Chamber of Commerce, Port of Portland and the City of Portland have previously joined in presenting the needs and advantages of Portland for such air service; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, that the City of Albany urges that permanent certificates for air service between Hawaii and Portland be granted to both Pan American World Airways and to Northwest Airlines and respectfully urges the Civil Aeronautics Board to grant such permanent certificates without delay, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mayor Terry D. Schrunk of Portland, a member of the executive committee of the League of Oregon Cities, hereby is authorized to present this resolution to the Civil Aeronautics Board.
