RESOLUTION NO. 2647

WHEREAS, young people of this community have expressed concern for the lack of social activity for persons in the age group of 17 to 21; and

WHEREAS, on Friday and Saturday nights these young residents seeking social activity "caravan" on certain city streets and park their vehicles upon private property, often without approval of the property owner; and

WHEREAS, the "caravaning" of many vehicles causes excessive street congestion impeding the movement of other persons and adversely impacting the conduct of some local businesses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that a task force of eleven citizens be appointed by the Mayor to study the needs of these young people and means of reducing the impact of "caravaning" and the associated parking upon other motorists and area businesses and to report to the City Council not later than February, 1987.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force consider at least the following issues:

- 1. What kinds of activity would meet the needs of these young people? What existing resources in the community can be used to meet the needs? How could additional activities best be provided? How can these young people be encouraged to take part in these activities?
- 2. What problems are created by "caravaning"? How can the practice be altered to minimize these problems?
- 3. What problems are created by the parking of vehicles associated with "caravaning"? What steps can property owners take to overcome these problems? What is the role of the City in addressing these problems?
