SUBJECT: ST-96-4, LOCHNER ROAD LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (LID)

Action Requested:

Staff requests the Committee recommend Council acceptance of this engineer's report and schedule a public hearing for February 26, 1997, at which time the proposed formation of a Local Improvement District (LID) for the street improvements for Lochner Road will be considered.

Background:

On November 26, 1996, a petition was submitted to construct urban improvements on Lochner Road along the east property line of the Oregon Youth Authority property. The requested work includes street, sidewalk, and storm drain system. The improvements are for a "partial street improvement" consisting of two 14 foot travel lanes, curb, gutter, and sidewalk on the petitioners side of the street. A storm drain system will also be constructed with the roadwork. Because the improvements are only for the OYA frontage on Lochner Road, 100% of the benefitted property has petitioned to form the LID.

Discussion:


In response to Resolution No. 3688, this engineer's report has been prepared. Staff has met with Oregon Youth Authority Staff and discussed the project.

Lochner Road is presently a 22-feet to 24-feet wide substandard, street with minimal surfacing and drainage. The existing right-of-way varies between 60 and 50 feet. An additional 20 foot right of way will be acquired from OYA to provide for the desired future 80 foot right of way. The street improvements proposed would reconstruct the street to be 28 feet wide with curb and gutter, sidewalks, landscaping, storm drainage and street lights on the west side of the street. Improvements on the east side of the street would consist of a gravel shoulder and ditch. The storm drain system will be designed for connection of east side improvements in the future.

Summary of Estimated Costs:

Work quantities have been estimated based upon schematic street and storm drain designs. The estimated costs of the various work items are derived from the costs for similar work items on other City of Albany projects. The final amount of the assessment will be based upon the actual bid unit prices and the actual work quantities. These are expected to vary from the estimate.

Section 3. Number of similar lots and property held by the City through foreclosure.

The City has no lots being held through foreclosure.

Section 4. Delinquency rate of assessments and taxes in the area.

Delinquency rate for all special assessment accounts is less than 1%. No properties are in foreclosure.

Section 5. Real estate value trends in the area.

Property values in this area are consistent with the other sections of the City. Values have increased an average of 14% per year.

Section 6. Tax levy trends and potential financial impact on the proposed LID.

The proposed development on this property will be tax exempt and will not be affected by anticipated tax reductions from Measure 47.

Section 7. Does the project conform to the City Comprehensive Plan.

The project does conform to the Comprehensive Plan.

Section 8. Status of City's debt.

The City has no improvement bonds outstanding. The City does, however, plan to issue approximately \$2 million by June 1997.

Section 9. Estimated cost of financing.

Estimated cost of financing is 8%. (6% bond interest plus 2% Admin. fee)

Section 10. General credit worthiness of property owners within the LID.

Oregon Youth Authority is an agency of the State of Oregon. Approximately \$600,000 of the estimated \$930,000 assessment will be paid through a grant from Linn County. Because of the anticipated accelerated repayment of this assessment, no bond sale is planned.
