## RESOLUTION NO. 4059

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF AN APPLICATION FOR TEA-21 TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT FUNDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF MULTI-USE PATHS ALONG THE WILLAMETTE RIVER AND A COMMITMENT TO PROVIDE THE REQUIRED LOCAL MATCH.

WHEREAS, the Oregon Department of Transportation is administering the distribution of federal highway funds provided by the Transportation Equity Act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (TEA-21) to local jurisdictions for the construction of transportation system enhancement projects; and

WHEREAS, a local match of 10.27 percent is required; and

WHEREAS, receipt of these funds will allow the City to construct pedestrian and bicycle transportation improvements to provide multi-use paths along the Willamette River between Monteith Riverfront Park and Bowman Park, between Bowman Park and Pacific Boulevard, and between Bowman Park and Teledyne Wah Chang; and

WHEREAS, a commitment to maintain these constructed facilities is required; and

WHEREAS, at the City Council meeting on December 16, 1998, the Albany City Council authorized staff to prepare an application for TEA-21 funding for these projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Albany approves and endorses the submittal of applications to the Oregon Department of Transportation for TEA-21 funds for the purpose of constructing these transportation enhancement facilities.
