RESOLUTION NO. 4446

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A TRAFFIC CALMING PROGRAM TO FUND TRAFFIC CALMING IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, the City of Albany owns and maintains all City streets inside the city limits; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to provide traffic calming alternatives to residents living on City streets that are impacted by high volumes or speed; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to establish a Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Neighborhood Traffic Calming programs may be used by residents to initiate a process to get a traffic calming device installed on their fronting street. The following requirements must be satisfied to qualify for traffic calming device installation:

- 1. The resident must complete an application to the traffic calming program and conduct vehicle counts and a speed study.
- 2. The fronting land uses must be at least seventy-five percent (75%) residential and institutional, including parks.
- 3. The fronting street must meet the minimum criteria identified in Table 1 located in Attachment A.
- 4. More than 50 percent (50%) of the adjacent owners must agree that the traffic calming device recommended in the traffic calming plan developed by City Staff, adjacent owners, and the Traffic Safety Commission is appropriate.
- 5. The Traffic Safety Commission approves the traffic calming device.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that residents shall pay a portion of the construction costs in accordance with the schedule identified in Table 2 located in Attachment A.
