The "Loop" makes 11 runs per day leaving Albany at 6:30 a.m. Service ends at 7:00 p.m. Primary stops are downtown Albany, Linn-Benton Community College, Oregon State University, downtown Corvallis, and Hewlett-Packard Company. On-call or flag stops are allowed on Highways 20 and 34 where it is safe for the bus to pull over out of the traffic lane, thus allowing transit access in rural areas.
