1. Call to Order (2:32)		The Commissioner continued with the meeting at 2:32pm.
2. Agenda Review		There were no changes to the agenda.
3. Public Comment		There were no public comments.
4. COVID-19 Future Planning Update (2:34)	Barry Hoffman discusses how there is a small fleet and small number of drivers, and is concerned when pre-COVID ridership will start.	An operations plan for the first week to determine need, and a
	Sarah Bronstein mentions OSU classes start on September 23 rd , but students will be moving in the weekend prior so starting service should begin with that Monday. Ken Bronson says that LBCC has an opening day on the 23 rd as well, and Barry Hoffman agrees that it makes sense to start service on that week. On Wednesday the 23 rd , the Loop will start service as normal. Bronstein mentions that the smoke conditions have restricted OSU's activities.	press release plan to inform the public has been made.

Mark Volmert discusses how likely and challenging it is for students to be left at the curb considering the capacity restrictions, and mentions to offer an insert or information for the students as a heads up. Brad Dillingham asks if there is a possibility to offer a phone number for riders to call to ask if there is room on the bus, with the condition that the space isn't guaranteed. Barry Hoffman is hesitant because he doesn't want to give the impression that someone can reserve a spot on the bus.

Mark Barnard talks to Tim Bates about testing GTFS data protocols. Barnard says this is a perfect conditions for a GTFS data problem/solution using GTFS ride information.

Barry Hoffman asks Sheldon Flom about LBCC and their in person instructions. Flom says it is very limited; most of the classes will be held remote. Those who are on campus will be for lab courses. The activities on the 23rd are mostly online as well.

Nick Meltzer asks Barry Hoffman about when the increase of ridership first shows up. Hoffman says it is when school first opens, from the dual enrollment between LBCC and OSU students. Meltzer mentions that there is a spare bus for available, and if it is possible to run that bus to guarantee no one gets left behind. Hoffman says that the trailer bus is the spare bus for the morning. That it operates as an overflow bus already, and the problem is that together, there is only 26 passengers those two buses can carry. It entirely depends on the demand. It is possible to have a driver on call for the first few weeks, but it can't be done for the entire term.

Catherine Rohan asks Barry Hoffman if drivers keep track how many riders get left behind. Hoffman says they do, and describe the condition in which they were left behind so he could expect a phone call from them.

Tim Bates discusses focusing on where people will be left behind. He offers an additional bus and driver by the OSU lot, and have them on standby for the first week to try to determine where the need and support is needed. Barry Hoffman says that bill will be available to be submitted for him, and that's a good solution for help with the distance problem.

Barry Hoffman says that the campus connector will be running every 30 minutes, so if there are students who do get left behind, they won't be left behind for too long.

Tim Bates questions about the number of students who are dual enrolled in OSU and LBCC. Sheldon Flom says he will try to find out. Sarah Bronstein mentions that regardless the dual enrollment, the traffic between LBCC and OSU will be significantly lower because LBCC only has in person courses for labs.

Barry Hoffman asks Tim Bates if there can be a standby bus on the 23rd-29th, between 8am to 10:30-11am to see where the need is most needed, and help those who get those left behind where they need to go.

Ken says they will be running the express on the 28th in the morning and afternoons, which should take care of any overburden during that time.

Sarah Bronstein says someone mentioned using the Baro as to moderate their service (baro.editor@oregonstate.edu
http://www.orangemedianetwork.com/daily_barometer/site/about.html) if someone wants to send their information and the status of transit.

Mark Volmert asks Nick Meltzer about adding the Ride Share information to a press release for the students. Meltzer agrees and will help coordinate sending that information out.

Sheldon Flom says there is a student question about student IDs and how many won't go to campus without a new ID. Barry Hoffman says the Loop has been fareless since April, and will still be boarding through the back door and ID won't be required. If we go back to charging fares, it will reduce the number of houseless persons riding the bus, which could increase the limited number of seats on the bus. However, currently they don't need a student ID to ride the Loop, and so the number of student vs regular rides will be skewed.

Sheldon Flom says OSU is going to a new ID format, so the ID's will be available on their phones, which will have an expiration date.

Nick Meltzer mentions that there is a final vendor for Real Time data so all the buses in the region, and we have a response for a mobile ticketing vendor as well. The full launch will be done by winter term.

Ken says students are fareless for the Shuttle, but the express is still \$1 for normal riders to keep running as a transits system and not a temporary housing system.

Sheldon Flom says that there are currently 2100 on campus students at OSU, and there are 350 number of dual enrolled students for OSU and LBCC. Barry Hoffman suggests reaching out to the 350 students, but is uncertain on how to reach out to the 2100 campus students. Sarah Bronstein agrees to reach out to the 350 students would be a more direct way to inform the students. Flom says he will try to gain the contact information of those students.

	Tim Bates mentions that this is no longer mass transportation anymore. Mark Volmert agrees, and asks Mark Bernard about government staff hearing regarding changing the COVID-19 guidance. Bernard has not heard of anything expect the number of cases have stabilized, but no guidance of relaxing the precautions.
5. Updates and Other Business (3:18)	Mark Volmert mentions about a potential suit of STIF grants for stop enhancement. Nick Meltzer says those discussions are still underway but they're being tracked. Barry Hoffman discusses the new Albany transit buses are due to go online in January, and the 2 nd is in February. Those buses will be driven from Minnesota, but will be ready for the spring of 2021.
	Mark Bernard suggests to Barry Hoffman about Swiftly, they allow for text alerts, and that is one way to manage changes in demand and communicate that instant information. Hoffman agrees that is a need and it will support the demand of up to date information. Bernard says those text alerts are well used and have received applaud for that information and service.
	Tim Bates asks Nick Meltzer about the mobile ticketing and Swiftly. Meltzer says we have a notice to award to Swiftly. Meltzer shows the TAC a preview of the new CW Ride website.
	Brad Dillingham states that Benton County Transit is changing their name to Benton Area Transit.
	Tim Bates says they are updating their transit app, Connections, with some giant reader boards and a capacity text. He hopes they will be up and ready by 2021.

	Barry Hoffman asks to confirm the buses will have an automatic passenger counter, and it will change its status based upon those who board or leave the buses. Tim Bates agrees, but it will be difficult considering the buses are boarding only in the back, but that should be a short term accommodation. Hoffman says the new buses will come with an automatic passenger counter as well.
