Fulton Street Stop Sign Request:

The commission continued the November discussion about moving the location of the stop sign from Fulton Street to 4th Avenue based on the data Irish collected. McCullough made a motion to change the location of the stop signs as presented, Kratch seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.

Highway 20 Corridor Study Presentation Recap:

Irish delivered a brief recap of the Highway 20 Corridor Study that was presented at the January 22, 2024, City Council work session.

Ramirez left the meeting at 6 pm.

Waverly/Columbus Speed Zone Study:

Irish gave a recap of the Waverly/Columbus Speed Zone Study he requested the Oregon Department of Transportation perform. The response from ODOT was their recommendation based on average speed, culture, context, and crash rate. After some discussion Kratch made a motion to implement ODOT's recommended changes, Streitberger seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.

Continuation of Street Funding Discussion:

Public Works Director Chris Bailey delivered a continuation of the street funding discussion as previously presented to the Albany City Council and reported the council agreed we need to continue educating the community about the need for more revenue, as well as actively moving forward with an achievable plan to repair city streets.

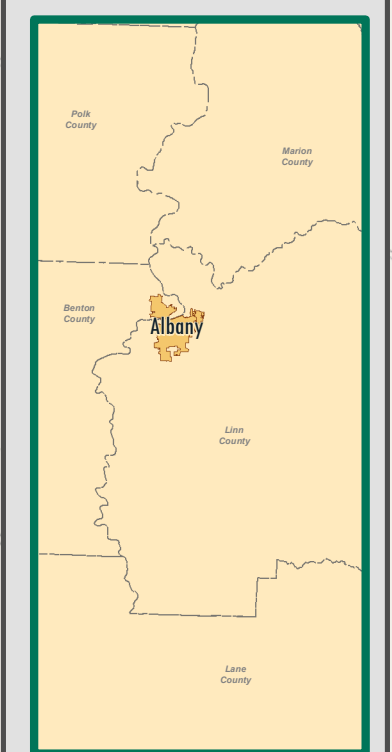
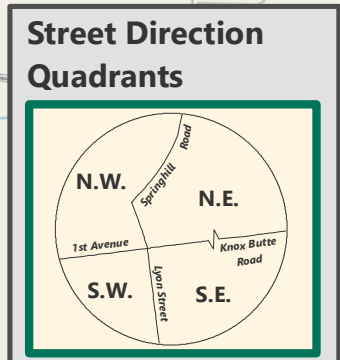
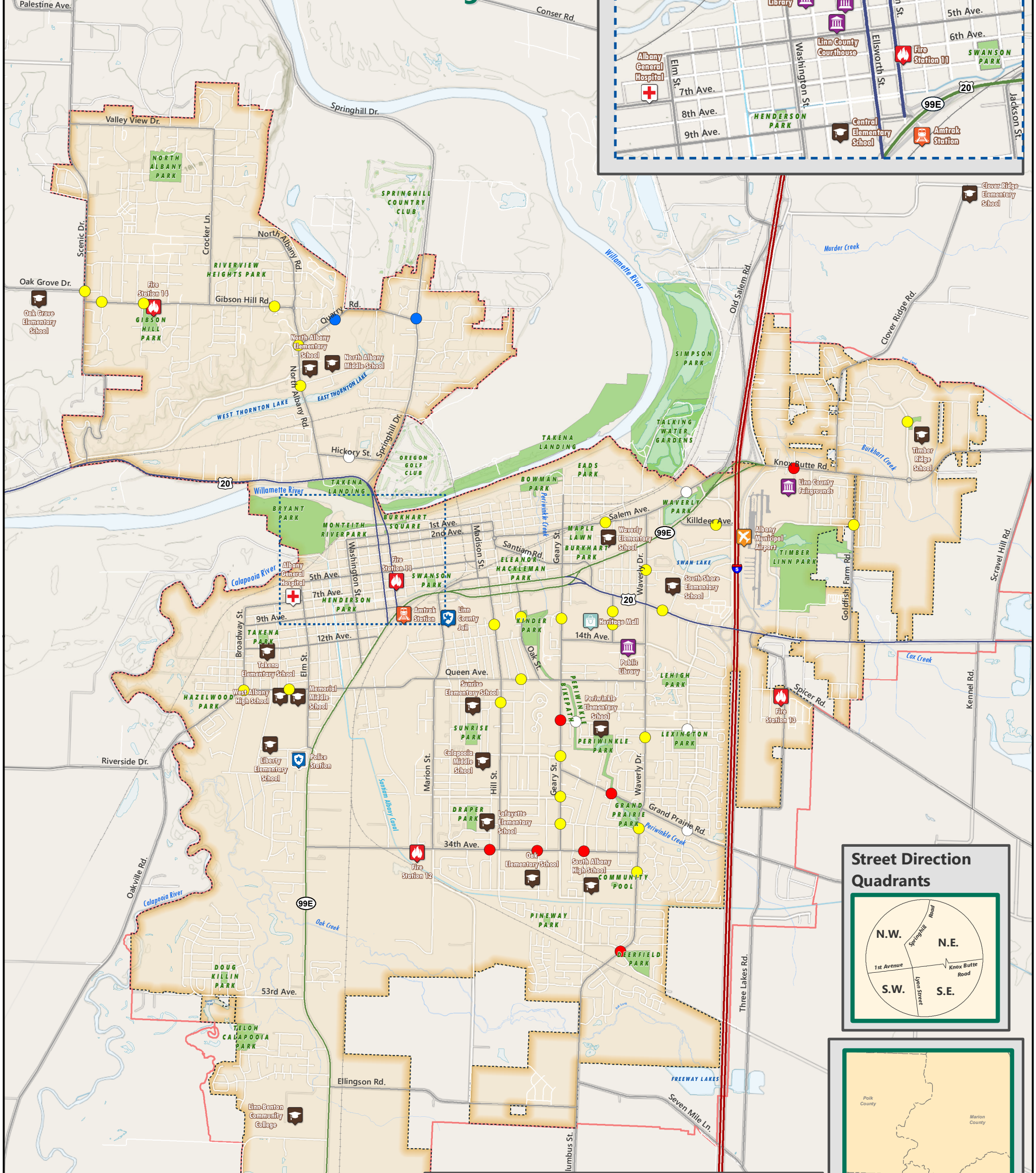
