CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by vice-chair Virnig at 7:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL

Commissioners present: Terry Virnig, Ann Ketter, Jim Lawrence, and Rob Bornheimer

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes from the January 28, 2020, meeting were approved unanimously.

INTRODUCTION OF NEW MEMBER

Mr. Pendley was not in attendance and will be introduced at a future meeting.

BUSINESS FROM THE PUBLIC

None.

WALK EVENT PLANNING

Ketter noted that the walk is scheduled for May 2nd. The day before is the wine walk scheduled by the City. Commissioner's discussed supplies (rocks and paint) needed to provide painted rocks for the walk event. Accepting donations from local business to fund prizes will require the City to come up with a form listing the information needed to identify the donation being to a tax-exempt organization. Irish will work on coming up with a form. Commissioner's discussed how to approach businesses and what to request in terms of donations.

CITIZEN ADVISORY GROUP TRAINING UPDATE

Irish described a training meeting for all City commission members and distributed information about the time and date.

PARKS & RECREATION DEPARTMENT MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Irish noted that the public input process had not started yet. Lawrence is on the stakeholder list and will be able to report back to the Commission as the update proceeds.

BUSINESS FROM THE COMMISSION

Irish distributed a calendar that showed event dates for commission activities throughout the year.

Steph Nappa joined the meeting at 7:40 p.m.

Lawrence spoke about problems cyclists face with the existing bridge crossing over the Willamette River. The Ellsworth bridge is not designed to accommodate cyclists and discourages trips across the river. Irish noted that a concept and project would need to be included in the City's Transportation System Plan in order to move it forward. Potential concepts include modifying the Lyon Street bridge to include a multi-use path along one

side. Steph Nappa suggested that converting downtown streets to a two-way travel pattern might make the multi-use path connection easier on the downtown side of the crossing.

Commissioner's discussed recent interest on part of Albany Area Metropolitan Planning Area, Corvallis Area Metropolitan Planning Area, and Oregon Department of Transportation to do capacity study for the Highway 20 corridor between Corvallis and Albany.
