Political signs posted on behalf of candidates for public office, or signs advocating measures on primary, general, or special election ballots are allowed in any zoning district, on private property, provided certain guidelines are followed.



Incorrect Sign Placement



Signs cannot be placed in the public right-of-way, such as sidewalks and the landscaping strips adjacent to them.



Signs cannot be placed in the clear vision area adjacent to driveways and intersections.



Is there a fee charged or application required to place political signs?

No.

Where may I place my signs?

On private property in any zoning district, with the permission of the property owner.

When may I place my signs?

Political signs may be displayed 45 days prior to the date that the ballots are distributed to the general population by each county and must be removed within 7 days after the election.

Is there a limit to the number of political signs I may display?

No.

May I place signs on utility poles or trees?

No.

How large may my sign be?

- 4 square feet per face in a Residential Zone
- 8 square feet per face in a Commercial or Industrial Zone
- A maximum dimension height of 3 feet in a Residential Zone
- A maximum dimension height of 5 feet in a Commercial or Industrial Zone

What can happen if I don't display my signs in a legal manner?

Violation of the sign ordinance may result in enforcement procedures against the candidate or the property owner.

Why is the City concerned with the placement of temporary signs?

As a public safety agency, we provide protection for pedestrians and safety for vehicles by keeping sidewalks, traffic control devices, and the line-of-sight areas near driveways and intersections free of obstructions.
